The workshop will take students through the process of identifying relevant issues and designing research projects. Basic issues to explore are multiple field-sites, power and voice in national and transnational contexts, mass culture and media competition for interpretive authority, ethical dilemmas and practical strategies in a fluid, multi-cultural environment.

Each student should come with a research theme or idea. Over the course of the workshop, we shall try to build a research design from the theme and construct a viable research proposal modeling after the expectations of major dissertation grant agencies. Conceptual frameworks from the social sciences field would be examined.
